Where did you get your horse? I bought Doc in 2004 from a client of Ryan Lovedahl's – Debra Herring. I don't have a trust fund so I had to move three horses to buy one and lucky for us it worked out.

What is your horse's breeding: By King Glo Solono, out of a Docs Lynx mare (double bred Doc Bar ~ yikes!).

Tell us something interesting about yourself: I work as a project manager for Cache Valley Electric in my spare time. I've lived in Bluffdale for 20 years, married with children. I Started riding when I met Rick 20+ years ago and in my previous life showed english and western pleasure horses.

When did you first join UBRA and how long have you been addicted to barrel racing: I joined UBRA about 12 years ago when my friend Julie Herman let me ride her husband's old grey rope horse Roanie. My first jackpot was at Lehi Rodeo Grounds and I think we cracked out a 20 second run ~ been working at it ever since. I also remember one jackpot at Spanish Fork, it was really cold and in the warm up pen Prince ran off with Annie Fisher (Rose) ~ clear across the pen like a maniac, then she came back in and smoked their socks off ~ I thought these people are crazy and I was right.

Tell us something interesting or noteworthy about your horse: Doc came from Giddings Texas where he was a junior rodeo horse. He is a scary-fast pole horse (I have yet to brave running him in poles). He has many successful siblings in the cutting horse world, one sister alone who has earned over \$250,000 in the cutting pen. Doc is 14 years young and has a heart big as all out doors. In the 2 ½ years I've ridden him he as never gone down the alley without giving 110% every time. My only complaint is that he'd run to a closed gate – or that I could ride him better to a closed gate.
